"I determined, at every hazard, to lift up the standard of emancipation in the eyes of the nation, within sight of Bunker Hill and in the birthplace of liberty. That standard is now unfurled; and long may it float, unhurt by the spoliations [damages] of time or the missiles of a desperate foe—yea, till every chain be broken, and every bondman set free!"
